The programme is supported by the Trust to minimise the workload for the schools.

#### The school's responsibilities will include:

- hosting one or two interns for 4-5 weeks at the end of the summer term
- conducting an interview and having the final say on whether to accept the interns
- applying for DBS clearance for the interns
- providing a mentor and a clear timetable for the interns

- work with pupils with SEN and/or on the G&T register
