Ogden Outreach Awards 2024

Award: Sustained Contribution to Outreach

This award recognises the sustained contribution of an individual to physics outreach. It acknowledges their significant achievements through either leadership, delivery or support of physics outreach. The award winner receives £1,000, to support their continuing outreach work.

Nominations should demonstrate how their work has contributed to the field of physics outreach over a sustained period of time and range of projects and programmes. This might include wider advocacy and championing of physics outreach both within and outside of the university.

The judges are not only interested in the outputs of their work but also the content, methodology and participants in their project and programmes. They are keen to see what has been learnt over the period of contribution, how it has impacted on how outreach is conducted and any broader cultural change their contribution to projects and programmes has enabled.

Successful nominations would be able to demonstrate answers to the questions laid out below.
